Both of these are good points, in fact taken together it would be more cost effective for us to provide a taxi for those attending and take them to the parish church in Kimpton, or Beachwood Green Baptist chapel or even to Central Baptist in Luton. So why do we persist?

These are some of our reasons: The church shows God's interest in a place and the people who live there. Of course, if we could no longer sustain meeting in Peter's Green that wouldn't mean God had stopped caring about the village, but the chapel is a physical reminder of the fact of God's love.

It serves a community, in my time here I have conducted two pastoral offices, a wedding and a funeral, it is a beautiful thing to be able to mark these events, one happy the other sad, in the village and amongst the community you live.

It allows us to hold special events, for example our Good Friday and Easter events, in the community.

Lastly, and personally, there is nothing better than, after week of hard work and a hectic Sunday in the large church in Luton, for me to drive through the countryside and worship in the quietness of the village, especially on a beautiful summer evening.

So to the church that meets in Peter's Green, greetings.





Coronation Weekend

Buckingham Palace announced details on the ceremonial, celebratory and community events that will take place over the Coronation Weekend between Saturday 6th and Monday 8th May 2023.

The Coronation of His Majesty The King and Her Majesty The Queen Consort will take place at Westminster Abbey on Saturday 6th May, 2023. The Service will be conducted by the Archbishop of Canterbury and will reflect the Monarch's role today and look towards the future, while being rooted in longstanding traditions and pageantry.

On Sunday, 7th May 2023, a special Coronation Concert will be staged and broadcast live at Windsor Castle by the BBC and BBC Studios.

The Coronation Big Lunch, at which neighbours and communities are invited to share food and fun together, will take place across the country on the same day.

On Monday, 8th May 2023, members of the public will be invited to take part in The Big Help Out, which is being organised by The Together Coalition and a wide range of partners such as The Scouts, the Royal Voluntary Service and faith groups from across the United Kingdom.

In tribute to His Majesty The King's public service, The Big Help Out will encourage people to try volunteering for themselves and join the work being undertaken to support their local areas. The aim of The Big Help Out is to use volunteering to bring communities together and create a lasting volunteering legacy from the Coronation Weekend.

Their Majesties The King and The Queen Consort hope the Coronation Weekend will provide an opportunity to spend time and celebrate with friends, families and communities across the United Kingdom, the Realms and the Commonwealth. Their Majesties are looking forward to marking the occasion with the public throughout 2023.
