Transforming Farms in Tanzania

This will support the Farming Partnerships Initiatives project through which farmers will receive 2 years of training in effective ways to grow more crops and breed live-stock. They then teach others in their community. Hundreds of families are transforming their farms, greatly improving their lives.

Most of us today harvest our food from supermarket shelves. In the Bible Leviticus 19:9 says 'When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap your field right up to its edge, neither shall you gather the gleanings after your harvest.' This was God's provision for those in society less well off than most who could collect the remaining harvest.

We can put this command from God into practice ourselves by donating one or two items from our weekly harvest to local food banks. Between April 2022 to March 2023 food banks in the Trussell Trust network distributed **2,986,203** Emergency Food Parcels in the United Kingdom. The need to provide for others is as great today as it was in the past and food produce given for the harvest festival will be donated to a local food bank.

On Remembrance Sunday we remember the service of those who fought in defence of freedom, and at Perry we especially remember the five men whose names are engraved on the village war memorial situated on the chapel wall.










All Age Harvest Festival Perry Green Chapel at Peters Green Sunday 1st October 6.00 pm.

6th Bn., Leicestershire Regiment. Killed in action on 03 May 1917 Age 21 Son of Henry and Annie Almond, of Chiltern Green.

4th Bn., Bedfordshire Regiment. Killed in action on 30 October 1917 Son of William and Emma Field of Wandon Green Remembered with Honour Poelcapelle British Cemetery

Richard John Hatton

8th Bn., Norfolk Regiment.Killed in action on 11 August 1917 Age 22 Son of David and Adelina Hatton, of Lawrence End Lodge Remembered with Honour Ypres (Menin Gate) Memorial

James Mumford

"B" Coy. 1st Bn., Bedfordshire Regiment. Killed in action on 22 October 1914 Son of William and Mahala Mumford; husband of Emily Helen Mumford, of Peter's Green Remembered with Honour Le Touret Memorial

Frank Smith

1/5th Battalion Durham Light Infantry. Died 15th July 1918 from war related sickness. Son of William and Amy Smith of Peter's Green Remembered with Honour Lille Southern Cemetery
